The clock is ticking down on what might very well be the best bang for your buck in all of SASS. I know that's saying a lot, but I think I can back it up.

First of all, here's what you get. You can start on Thursday and shoot your pick of 19 side matches, including the Great Train Robbery, Long Range Buffalo Hunt, a 3 stage night black powder shoot, and a 3 stage warm up match. Hardly anybody shoots them all, though you could. I skip the ones I know I'm not any good at. For instance, you will never see me shoot a speed shotgun side match, and if you've seen me shoot, you know why.

On Friday it's five main stages in the morning, lunch, and more optional side matches in the afternoon, namely The Professionals, a pot shoot stage, cowboy clays, and a pot luck supper. Saturday it's five more main match stages and lunch, followed by awards, banquet, and dancing.

On Sunday, if you have any ammunition and energy left, there is more shooting to be had in team post cutting, the team shootout, the couples shootout, and the Last Man/Woman Standing shootoff.


All of the above is included in the \$80.00 match fee with the exception of the optional warm up stages (\$10.00), cowboy clays (\$5.00), and pot shoot (\$10.00). The Yelping Coyote is \$20.00 or \$10.00, depending on your taste in beverages, and that is a great deal.

At some matches you pay \$20.00 for dry camping a half-mile or more from the range. At *Defend the Roost*, camping is free and your RV will be within 150 feet of the firing line.

It's a fun match, priced right, access is easy, and I have barely mentioned the food. *Defend the Roost* is justifiably famous for the good food we provide, and this year will be no exception.
