A good theme doesn't mean much if the stages aren't fun, but guess what, they were great! Eleven shooters turned out and had a ball. The usual suspects wound up in the top 5 (Bad Bascomb, Harvey Mushman, Ozark Lawdog, M.C. Ryder, and Venomous Doc). Cowboy Earl was right on their heels shooting cap and ball pistols. It was good to see Lumpy Grits, Ima Schofield (top lady on the day), and Ozark Lawdog out there again. M.C. Ryder and I shot "Pike." He did it well, and I gave a clinic on how not to do it.

On the 16th, thirteen vigilantes came out and got into it over Thanksgiving dinner seating arrangements at the hotel, alcohol (!) was involved in some trouble at the saloon, and Aunt Rosemary rolled in on the noon stage with 300 pounds of sweet potatoes, not to mention her bawdy sense of humor. Buckhorn Bud shot "Josey Wales," and it was great fun watching him shoot those 4 cap and ball pistols on every stage.

The top five shooters were Bad Bascomb, M. C. Ryder, Ozark Lawdog, Cowboy Earl, and Harvey Mushman, respectively. Goode Bascomb was the top lady on the day. Real Life Westerners You Didn't Want to Mess With

Third in a Series

James Riley was a frail 18-year-old Kansas boy with tuberculosis. He wasn't impressive to look at, but as the saying goes, some bad hombres once underestimated him at their peril.

A lawman by the name of Mike McCluskie took a liking to the skinny kid, took him under his wing, and taught him to shoot. McCluskie had a friend for life in young James, but McCluskie's life was going to be short.

On August 19, 1871, McCluskie found himself backed into a corner in a saloon in the cow town of Newton, Kansas. One week earlier he had killed a man named Bailey, ostensibly in the line of duty, but Bailey's Texan cowboy friends didn't see it that way, and figured McCluskie needed to pay.

One of the cowboys shot McCluskie in the neck. When he tried to fight back, his pistol mis-fired, prompting several cowboys to stand over him and finish him off.

At this point, James Riley entered the fray. He had never been involved in a gunfight before, and probably never was again, but his lack of experience was not to be a deterrent on that day.

With a revolver in each hand Riley started firing. When his guns were empty the room was filled with smoke, and he had wounded or killed seven men. Among them were some of the cowboys who had killed McCluskie, but also some innocent bystanders and a man named Jim Martin who had tried to prevent the fight in the first place. Martin would subsequently die of his wounds, a decent guy who was in the wrong place at the wrong time.

James Riley walked out of the saloon and was never seen or heard from again around Newton, or anywhere else; he simply disappeared. But a bunch of Texas cowboys never forgot him.

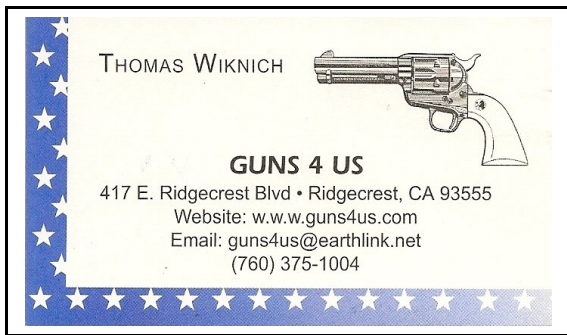
DEFEND THE ROOST 2014 ANNOUNCED

The Robbers Roost Vigilantes and GUNS4US present our 16th anniversary shoot Thursday through Saturday, May 15, 16, and 17, 2014. You can look forward to a full day of side matches on Thursday, including a three stage warm-up match, the Great Train Robbery, and a night black powder shoot. On Friday it will be five main stages and The Professionals, and on Saturday, five more main stages and Last Man/Woman Standing. Not to mention all the great food, Yelping Coyote, awards, and Cowboy Karaoke.

The major change is that DTR is a three-day event this time around. The "Sunday Funday" events have been eliminated, with the exception of the Last Man/Woman Standing, which has been moved to Saturday afternoon. The only Sunday event anybody turned out to shoot last time was LM/WS, but it wasn't set up, and nobody was real interested in doing it. Many people are worn out and thinking about getting packed up and heading home on Sunday, so we have accepted that reality and nothing is scheduled for Sunday.

Our membership application is here [RRV Membership Application](#) Annual membership dues for the RRV are: single membership \$25, member and spouse \$30, family membership (including children under 18 living at home) \$35. First time shooters will be able to take their FIRST (1) NEW SHOOTERS CLASS for \$10, any subsequent new shooters class or RRV match shoot will be \$10 members, \$15 nonmembers. Donations for shooting regular monthly RRV matches will be \$10 members, \$15 non-members. Memberships run from September 1 - August 31. New memberships purchased after September will be prorated depending on the number of months remaining and the type of membership. **RRV members are encouraged to become Single Action Shooting Society (SASS) members.** Please call SASS at (505) 843-1320, or go to www.sassnet.com. SASS first year single initiation membership is \$55, renewal for single membership is \$45. As part of your SASS membership you will receive The Cowboy Chronicle (12 issues/year), registration of your alias, a SASS badge with your SASS number on it, a membership certificate and membership card, a SASS Marshall lapel pin, and SASS Shooters Handbook.
